INTER-LOCAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

SUMMER RECREATION SCHOOL BUS

RENTAL AGREEMENT

This contract is entered into this	day of February, 2018 by and between
Township of Ocean Board of Education, a	a body politic, with offices at 163 Monmoutl
Road, Oakhurst, NJ 07755 ("the Board")	and the Township of Ocean, a body politic
with offices at 399 Monmouth Road, Oakl	hurst, NJ 07755 ("Township").

IT IS AGREED:

- 1. The Board will rent a maximum of eight 54-passenger school buses to the Township Recreation Department for use during their summer camp program.
- 2. This agreement will be in effect for the period from June 22, 2018 to August 18, 2018.
- 3. The Township will pay a flat fee of \$8,000. to the Board by September 1, 2017.
- 4. All dispatching services (Parent phone calls, routing etc.) will be handled by the Township recreation department.
- 5. The Township agrees to utilize its own fuel. However, if the need arises the Township will reimburse the Board for fuel used from our Transportation yard.
- 6. The Township agrees to reimburse the Board for any towing services that become necessary due to breakdown.
- 7. The Board mechanic is on duty from Monday thru Friday until 3:00 p.m. and the Board will be responsible for regular maintenance on said vehicles.
- 8. The Township will be responsible to direct their drivers to complete a daily pretrip inspection and notify the Board of potential mechanical problems by copy of this form.
- 9. All bus drivers utilized will be employed by the Township during the term of the agreement and the Township will only employ licensed CDL drivers with passenger endorsement and air brakes certification to operate the rented vehicles.

- 10. Any moving violation occurring during the rental period will be the responsibility of the Township and the individual contracted driver.
- 11. The Township acknowledges their auto liability insurance as primary coverage including comprehensive and collision. The Township will provide the Board with a certificate of insurance naming the Board of Education as additional insured before **June 22, 2018** and shall list the following coverage limits:
 - a) Automobile Liability \$1,000,000 liability limits
 - b) Workers' Compensation
 - c) General Liability with minimum limits of \$1/\$2 Million
 - d) Umbrella Liability with minimum limits of \$5,000,000
- 12. The Township agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Board for any claim involving any of the buses included in this agreement while under Township control.
- 13. This agreement has been duly authorized as an inter-local service pursuant to NJSA 40:8A-1.





Board Member Participation at Board Meetings Use Electronic Device(s)

0160 BOARD MEMBER PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS USING ELECTRONIC DEVICE(S)

The Board of Education recognizes a Board member may be unable to attend a Board Meeting due to a medical condition where the Board member's is prohibited from leaving their home due to the medical condition or due to a commitment requiring the Board member to be out-of-State during the time of the Board Meeting. In order to assist these Board members during these circumstances, the Board of Education will permit the Board member to participate in the Board Meeting through the use of an electronic device(s).

In the event a Board member has a medical condition that prohibits their attendance at a Board Meeting or a commitment that requires the Board member to be out-of-State during a Board Meeting, the Board member must have their participation in a Board Meeting using an electronic device pre-approved by the Board of Education at a Board Meeting prior to their anticipated absence. The Board member must submit a written request to the Board President indicating the date of the Board Meeting and the reason for the anticipated absence. The written request may include supporting documentation. The written request must be submitted at least five business days before the Board Meeting prior to the Board meeting the Board member is seeking participation through the use of an electronic device. The Board President will present the request to the Board and all requests must be approved by a majority of the full membership of the Board.

In the event the Board approves a request, the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall make arrangements to have the appropriate electronic equipment available at the site of the Board Meeting that will permit the Board member to listen to all aspects of the public meeting to include, but not limited to, Board member and administrative comments and deliberations, public comments, and presentations. The Board member participating via electronic equipment shall be provided, either in advance of the meeting or electronically just prior to or during the meeting, all handouts and supporting documentation that is presented, deliberated and voted on during the meeting. In addition, the electronic equipment must permit the Board President to recognize the Board member to make comments, ask questions, vote, and fully participate in the Board Meeting as if the Board member was present at the meeting. And, the Board member's comments, questions, votes and other aspects of his/her participation shall be amplified for all those in attendance at the meeting can hear his/her participation.
