

P 6154 TUITION INCOME PRESCHOOL STUDENTS

Tuition Guidelines

The Township of Ocean Board of Education shall operate a tuition based preschool program for district residents. The following rules shall apply to the payment of tuition for the preschool program:

- A. The parent or guardian submit the district preschool application form to the Superintendent or his or her designee requesting admission to the preschool program.
- B. The application shall be submitted by the deadline stated on the application form.
- C. Eligibility will be determined by screening results in order by which the names of applicants are picked from the lottery for available spots.
- D. The parent or guardian of eligible non-classified children shall agree to pay the preschool tuition rate set by the Board of Education by April of each school year.
- E. In order to hold placement in the program upon acceptance ten percent of the tuition must be paid within 2 weeks of notification of acceptance by the school district. This payment will be non-refundable.
 1. The balance of the tuition may be paid in total by August 1;
 2. Parents/guardians may opt for the school payment plan and the balance of the tuition shall be payable August 1, (fifty percent) and Jan 1 (fifty percent);
 3. All tuition payments shall be forwarded to the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary. No student will be enrolled until the first tuition payment is received;
 4. If at least a 50% tuition payment is not received by August 1 the student shall forfeit their space in the preschool program.

TUITION INCOME PRESCHOOL STUDENTS

- F. All applicants shall provide proof of residency and meet the eligibility requirements as set forth in Board Policy.
- G. The student shall maintain a satisfactory scholastic record, as well as a satisfactory discipline and attendance record.
- H. Preschool tuition students shall be subject to all Board policies and regulations governing the conduct and behavior.
- I. Preschool applicants shall be offered enrollment as space is available based on eligibility requirements.
- J. The Board shall consider and approve tuition reduction or waiver for financial hardship on a case by case basis. Families who have financial hardship due to unemployment, minimal employment and individuals meeting the qualifying Federal standards for free and reduced lunch may be considered for tuition reduction or waiver. An application form must be completed before confirmation of acceptance.
- K. Absences exceeding 20 days will result in non-classified students being dropped from the preschool program.
- L. Children must be toilet-trained, have up-to-date immunizations, and should have age-appropriate verbal skills.





BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board anticipates \$199,501 in Tuition/Transportation Revenue which is to be applied to the General Fund for the 2017-2018 school year;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board anticipates \$485,000 of Miscellaneous Revenue and Rental Income which is to be applied to the General Funds for the 2017-2018 school year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board anticipates \$7,770,200 of State Aid and \$475,000 of extraordinary Special Education Aid, which is to be applied to the General Funds for the 2017-2018 school year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board anticipates \$77,587 of Medicaid Reimbursement which is to be applied to the General Fund, for the 2017-2018 school year.



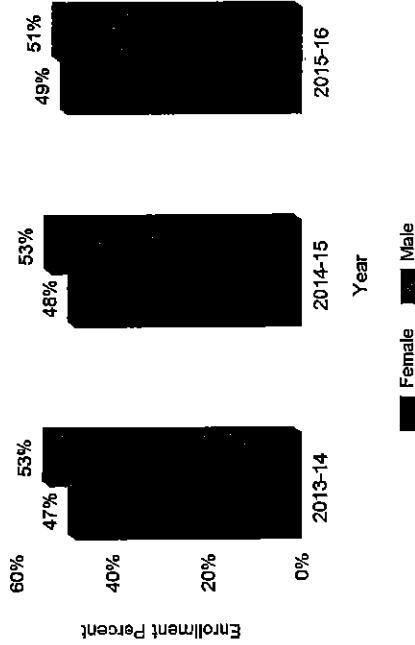
Enrollment by Grade

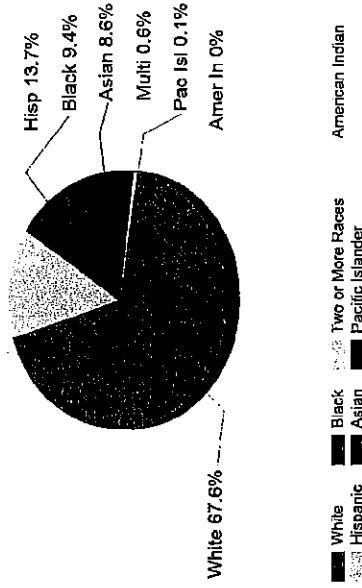
Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.



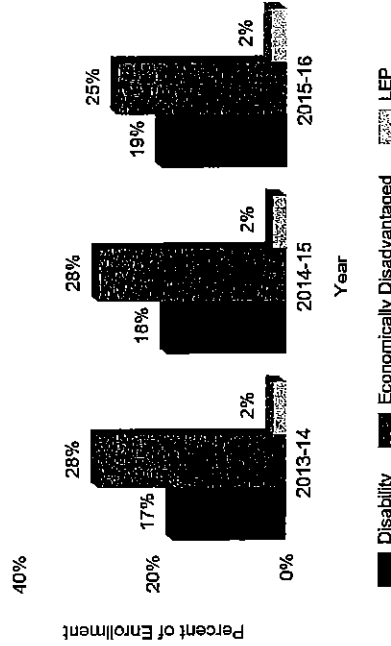
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

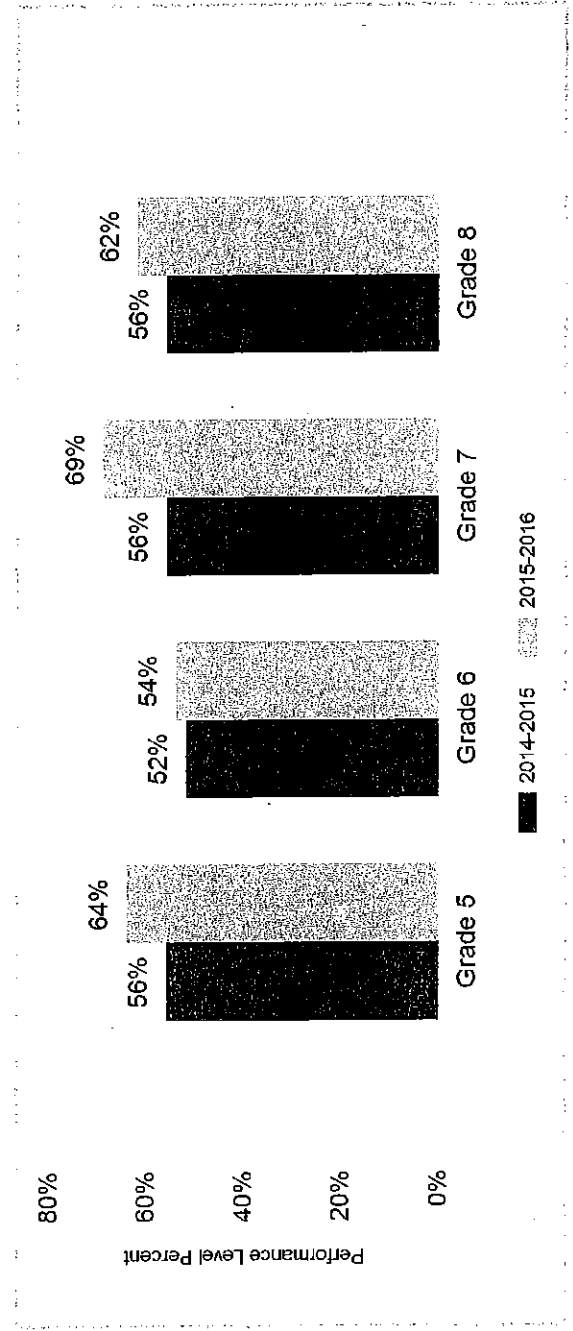

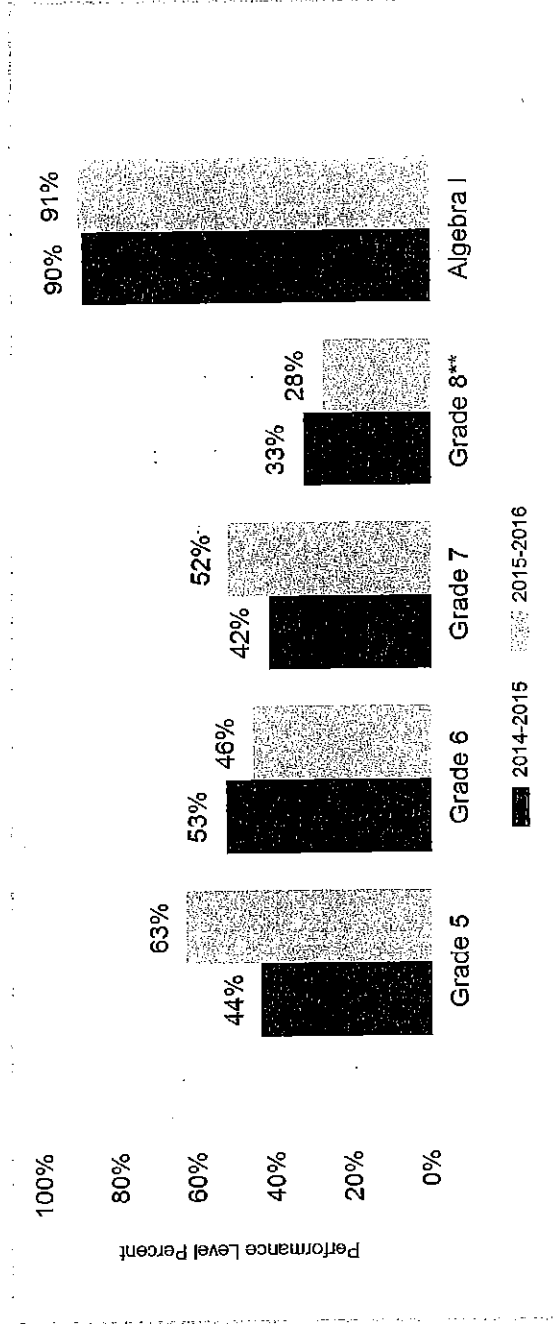

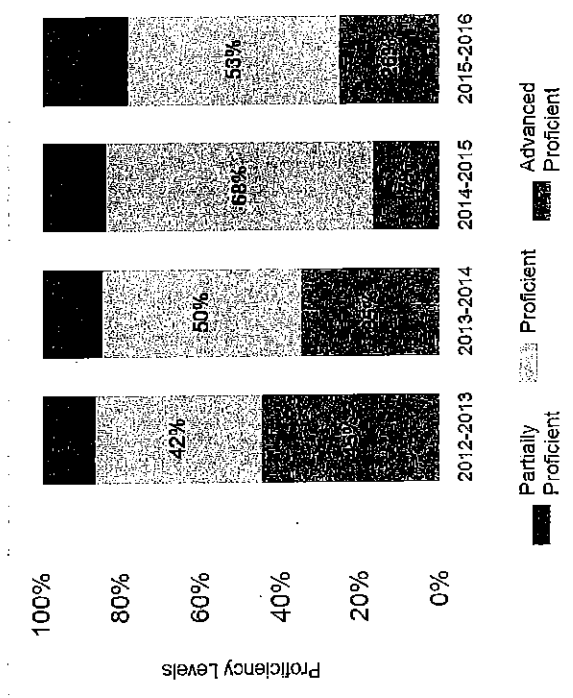

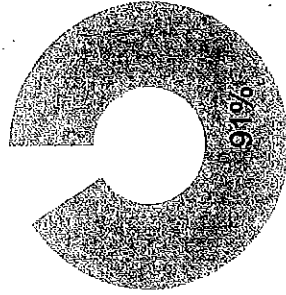

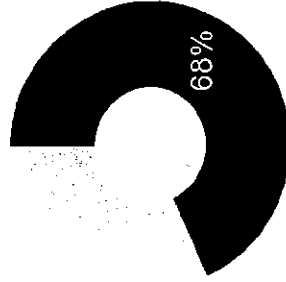

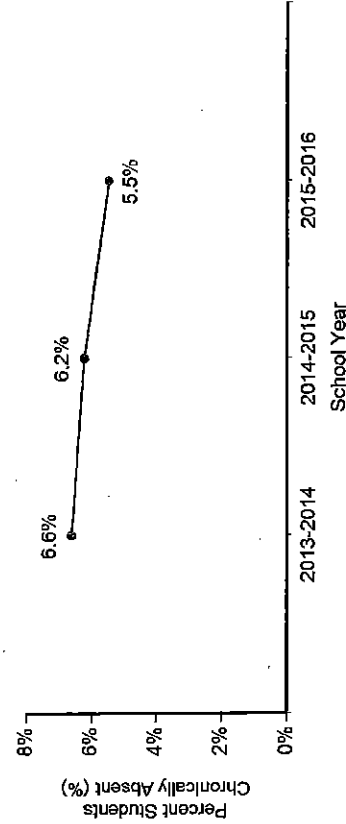

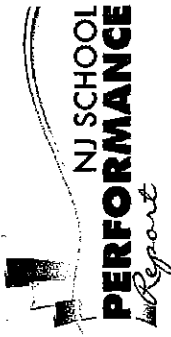

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) presents the 2015-16 School Performance Reports. These reports are designed to inform parents, educators and communities about how well a school is performing and preparing its students for college and careers. In particular, the School Performance Reports seek to:

- **Focus** attention on metrics that are indicative of college and career readiness.
- **Benchmark** a school's performance against other schools that are educating similar students, against district and state-wide outcomes, and against state targets to illuminate and build upon a school's strengths and identify areas for improvement.
- **Improve** educational outcomes for students by providing both longitudinal and growth data so that progress can be measured as part of an individual school's efforts to engage in continuous improvement.

While the New Jersey School Performance Reports seek to bring more information to educators and stakeholders about the performance of schools, they do not seek to distill the performance of schools into a single metric, a single score, or a simplified conclusion. Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.

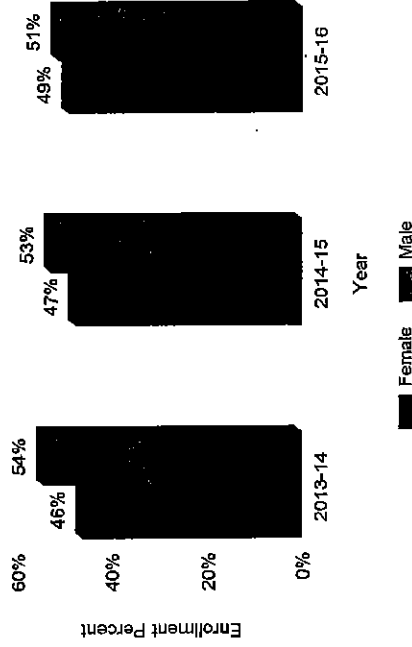

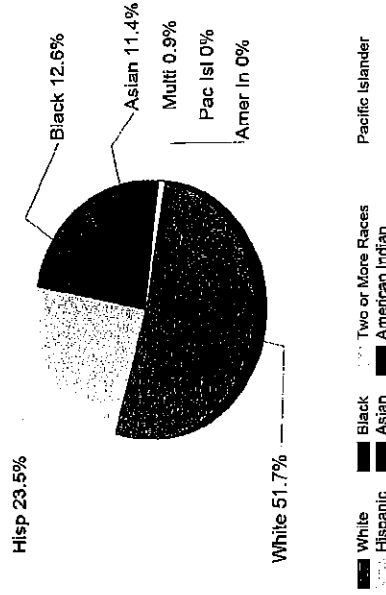
Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.



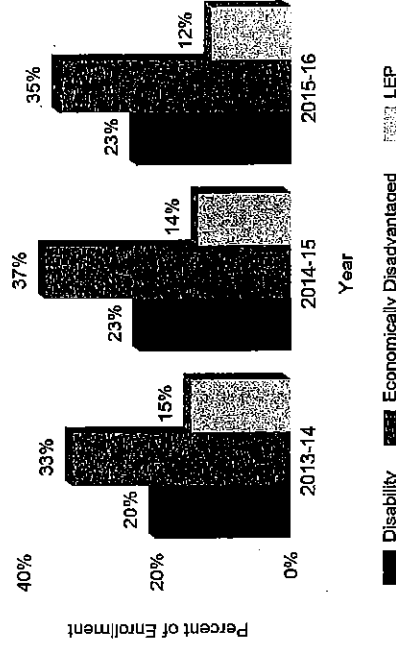
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

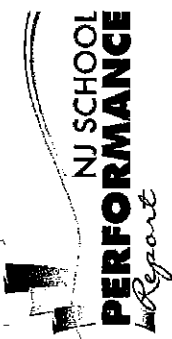

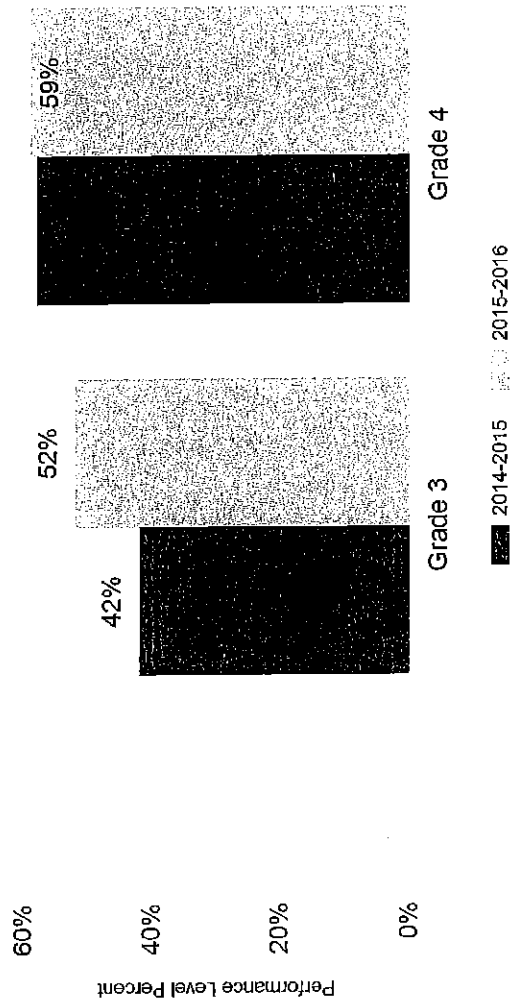

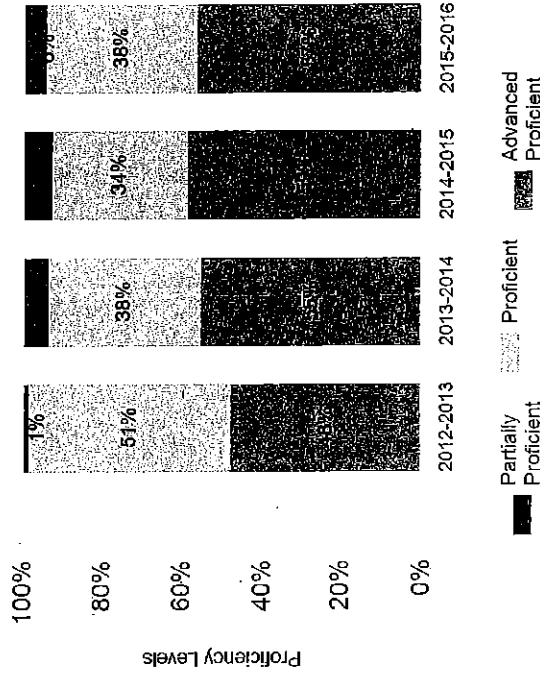

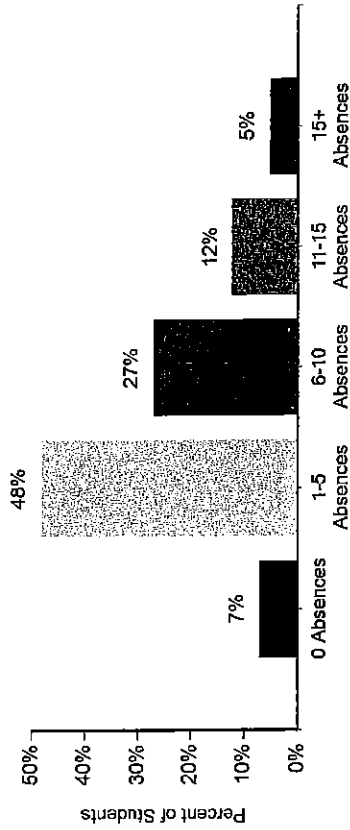

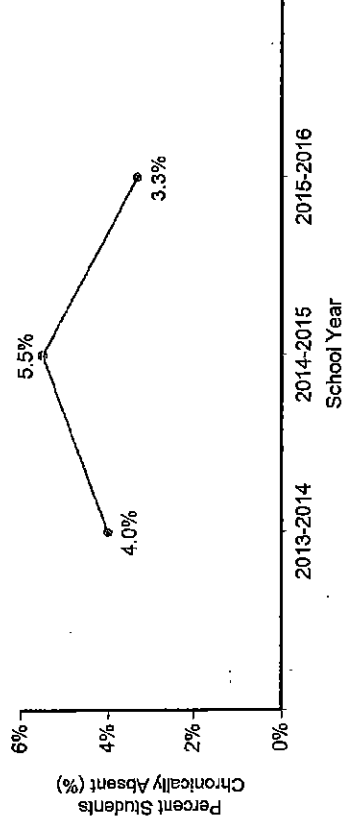

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) presents the 2015-16 School Performance Reports. These reports are designed to inform parents, educators and communities about how well a school is performing and preparing its students for college and careers. In particular, the School Performance Reports seek to:

- **Focus** attention on metrics that are indicative of college and career readiness.
- **Benchmark** a school's performance against other schools that are educating similar students, against district and state-wide outcomes, and against state targets to illuminate and build upon a school's strengths and identify areas for improvement.
- **Improve** educational outcomes for students by providing both longitudinal and growth data so that progress can be measured as part of an individual school's efforts to engage in continuous improvement.

While the New Jersey School Performance Reports seek to bring more information to educators and stakeholders about the performance of schools, they do not seek to distill the performance of schools into a single metric, a single score, or a simplified conclusion. Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.

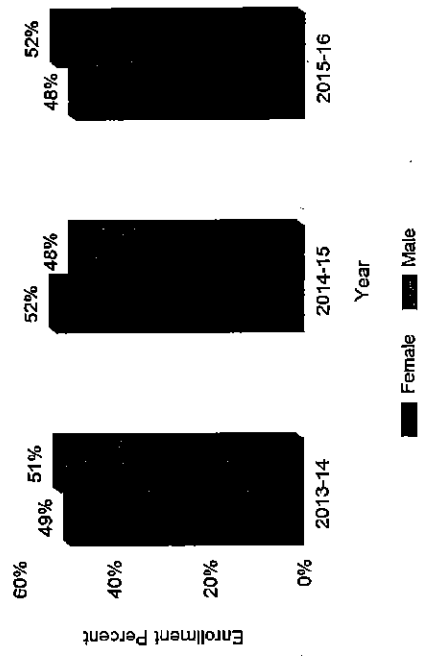

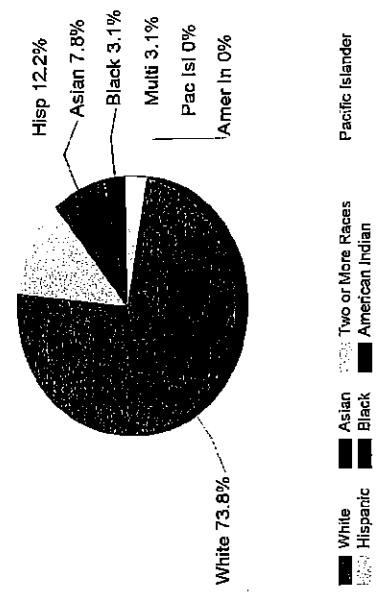
Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.



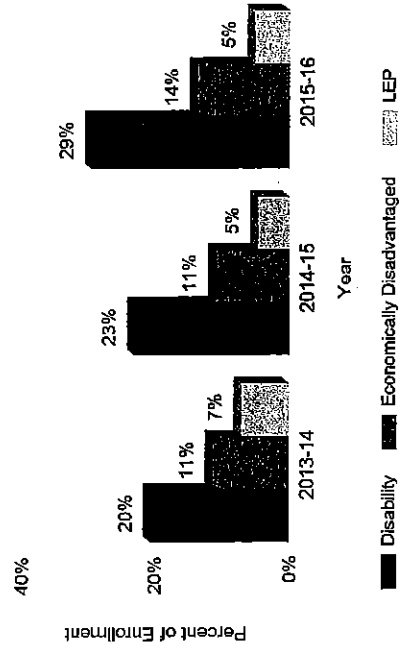
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

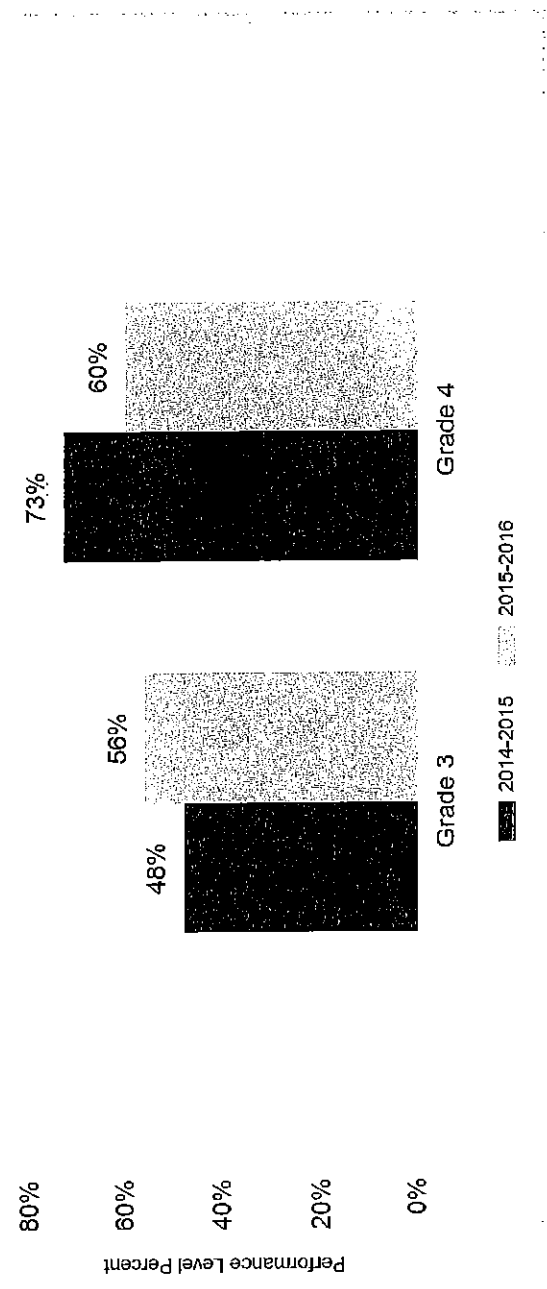

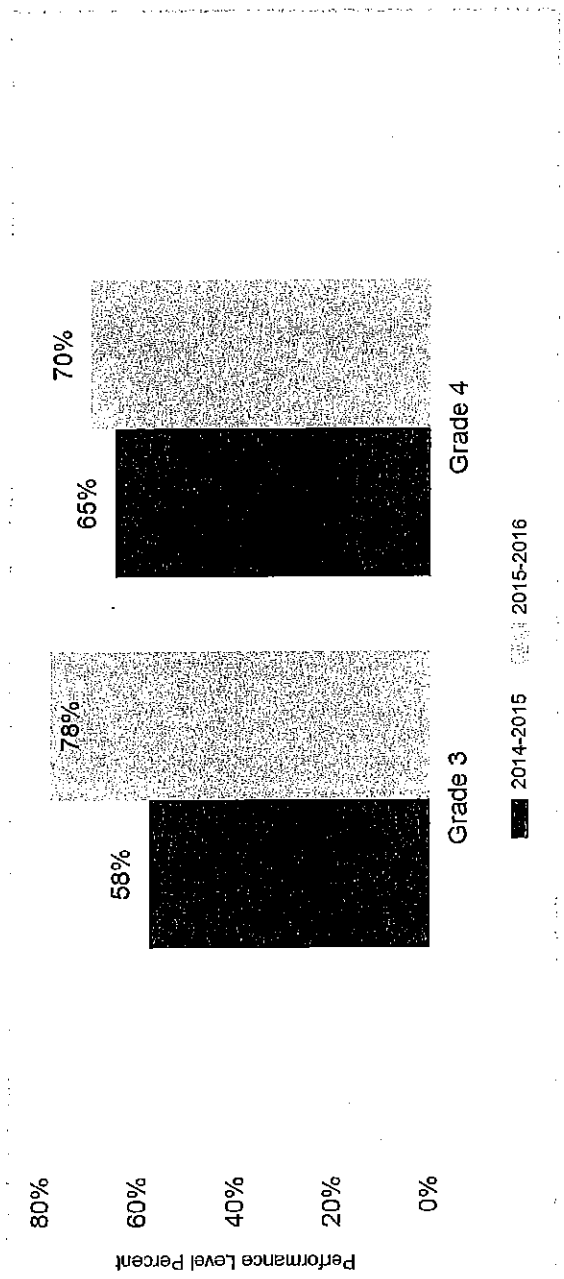

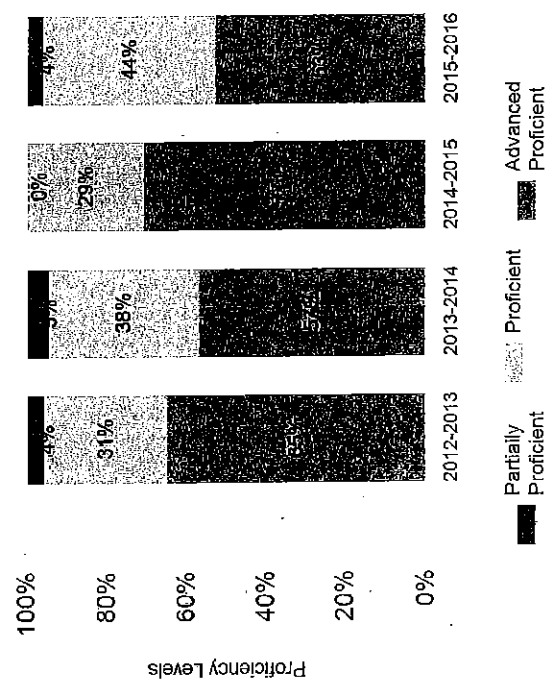

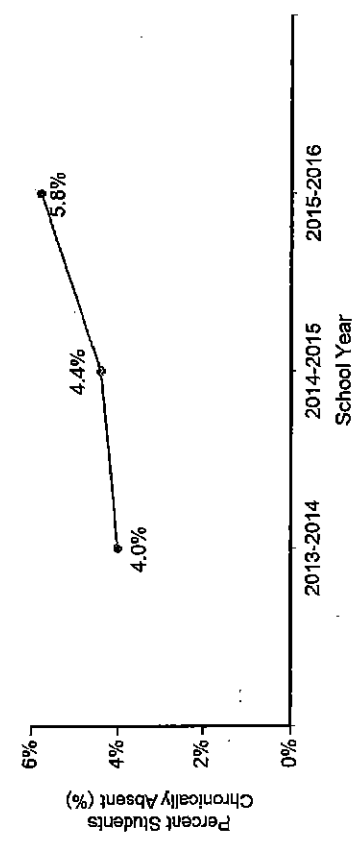

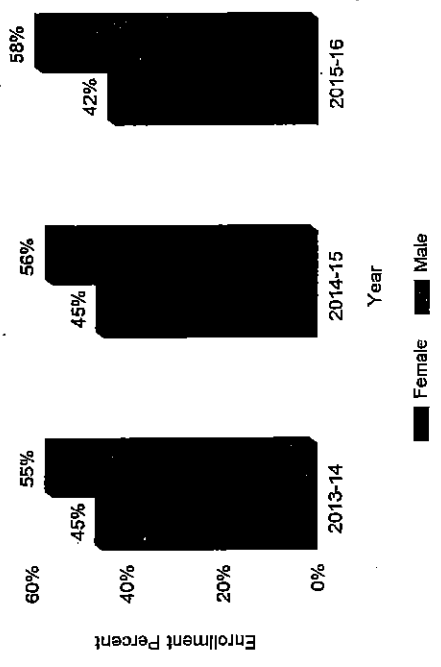

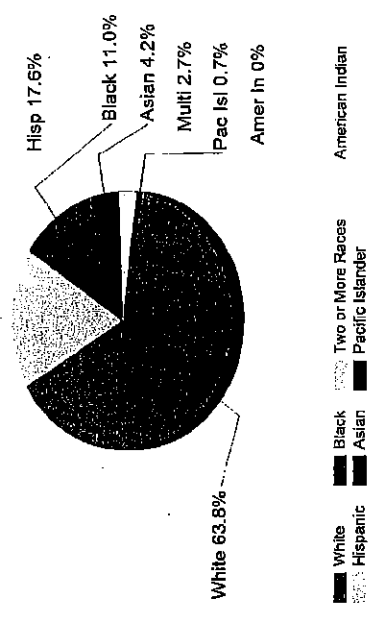
Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.



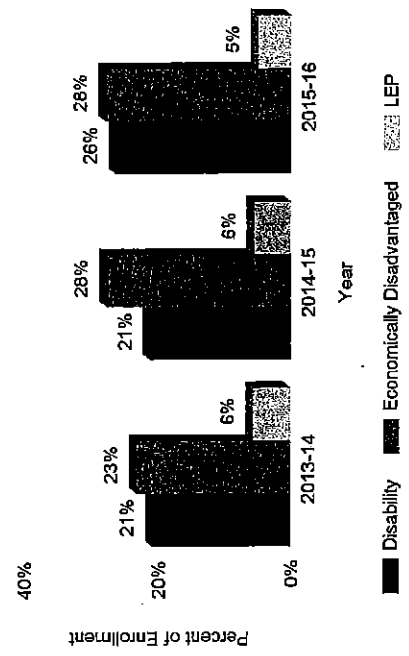
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

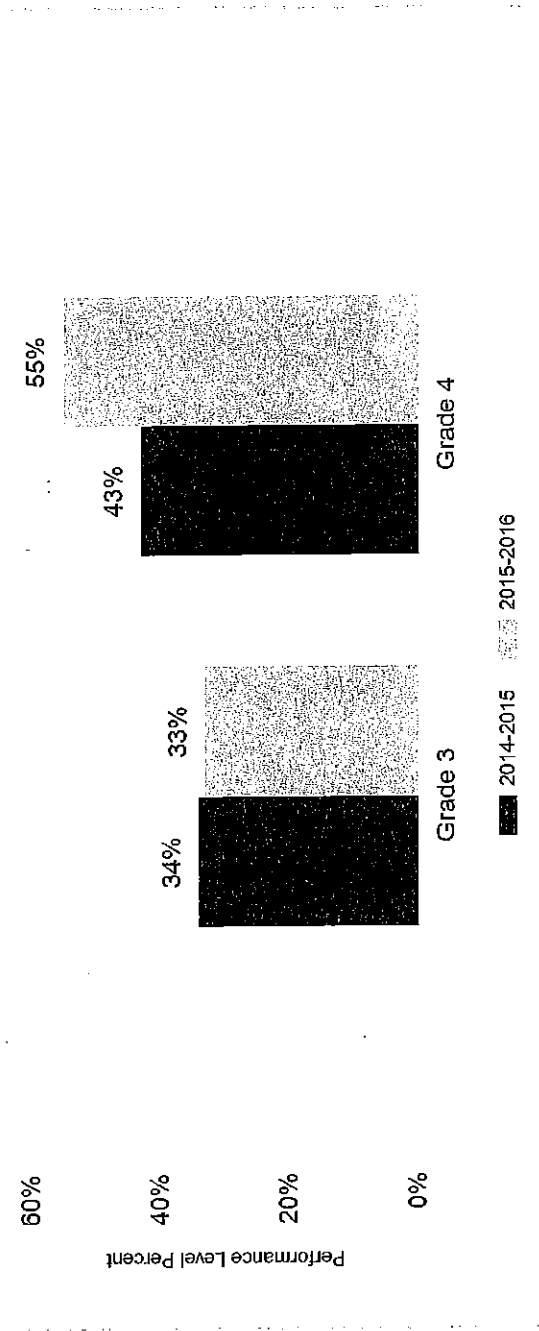

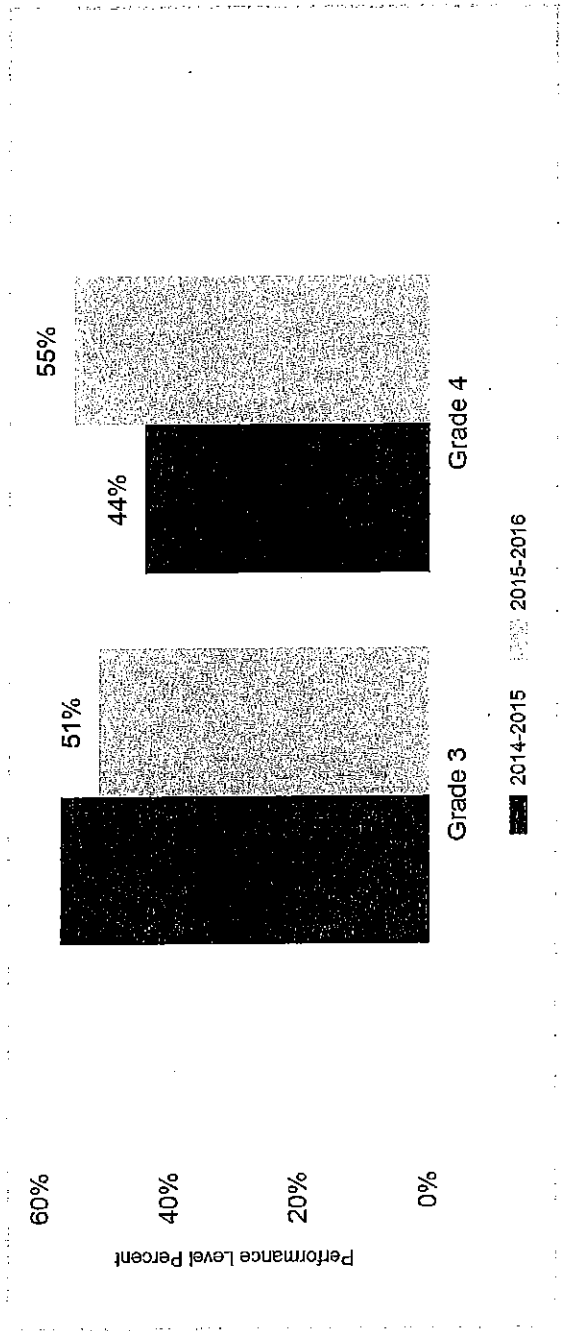

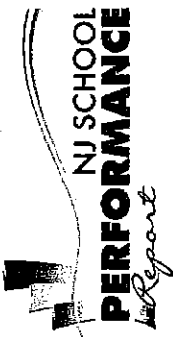

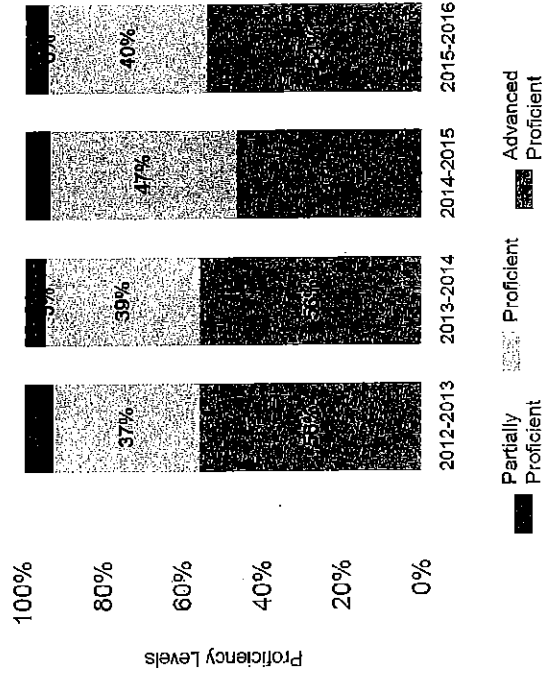

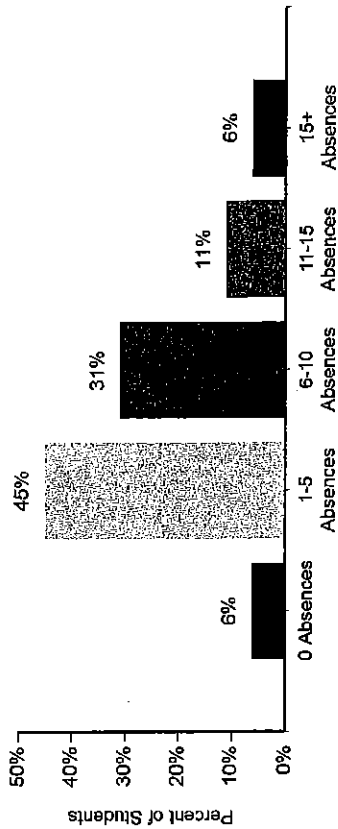

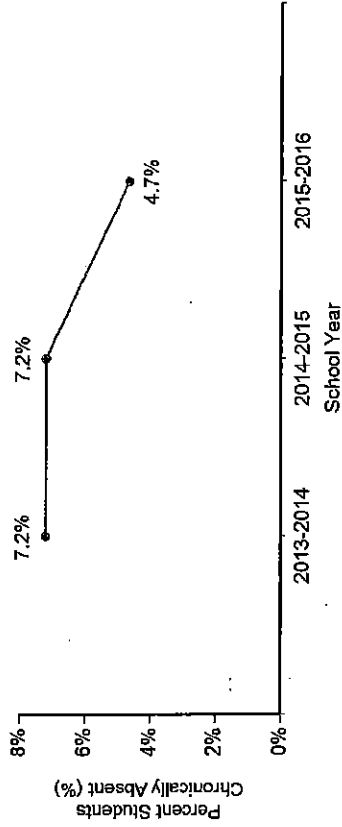
Absenteeism

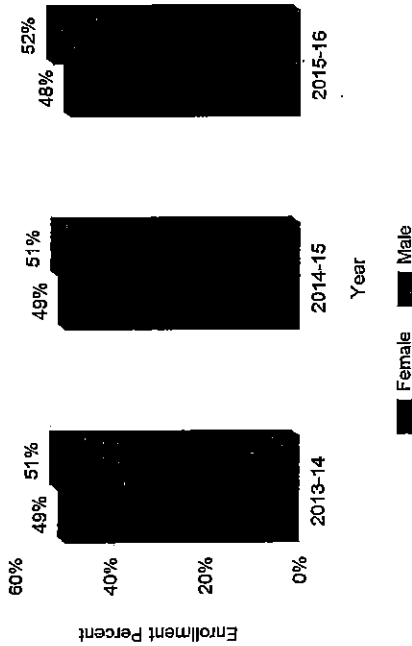

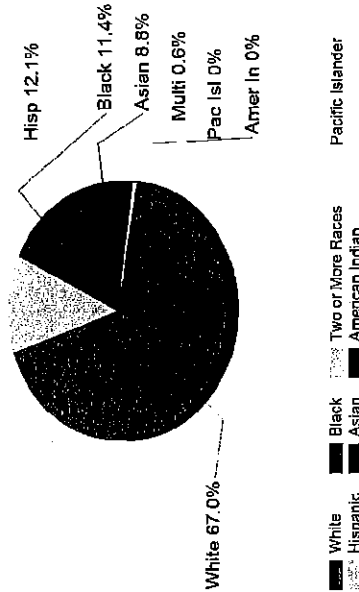
Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.



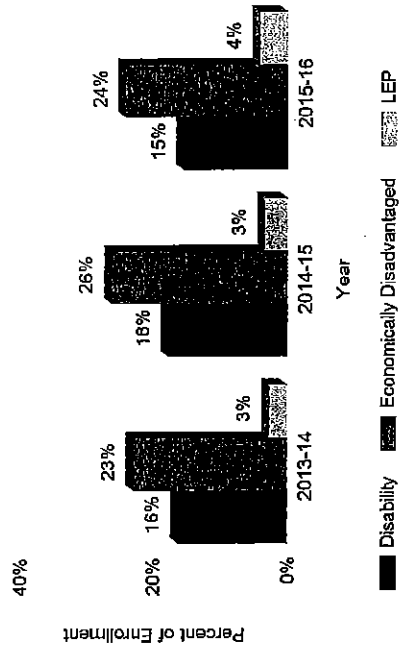
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

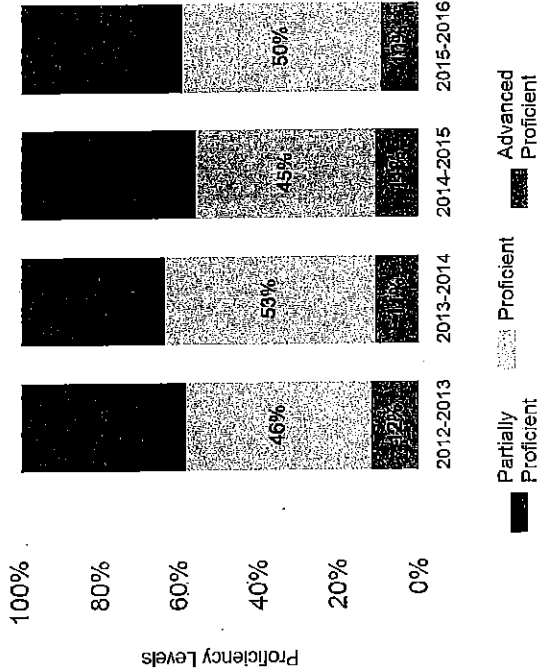

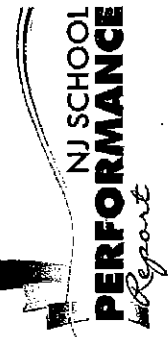

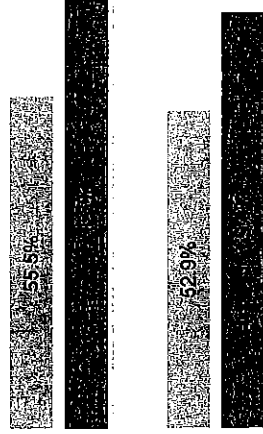

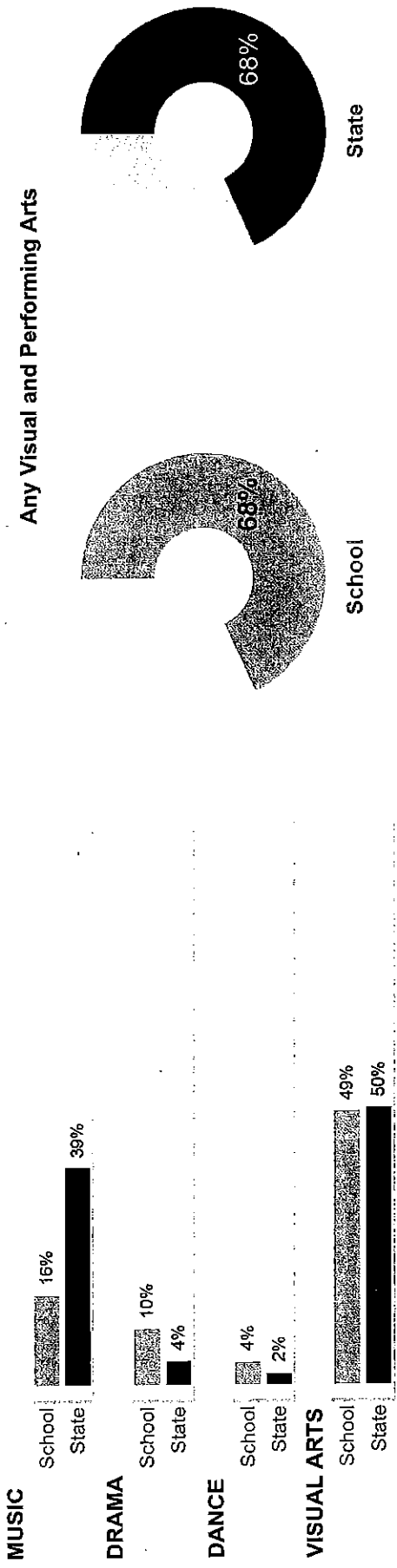

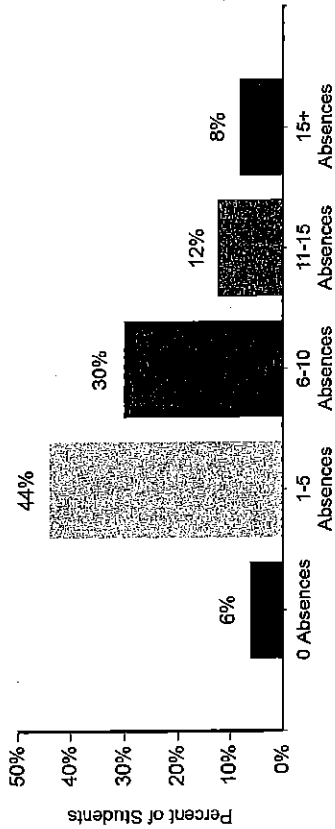

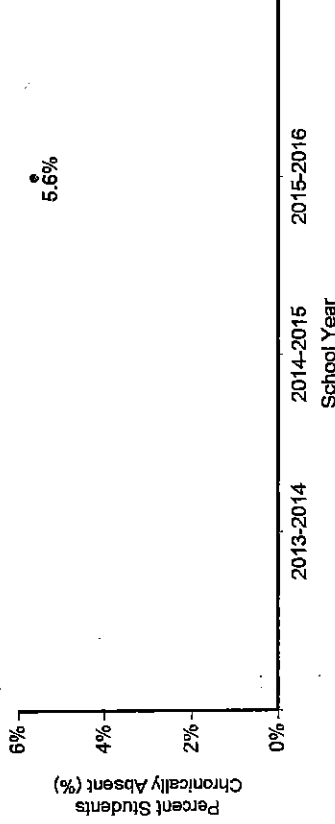
Absenteeism
